It is the sequel to Scream (2022) and the sixth installment in the Scream film series. The film stars Melissa Barrera, Jenna Ortega, Jasmin Savoy Brown, Mason Gooding, Hayden Panettiere, and Courteney Cox, all reprising their roles from previous installments, with Josh Segarra, Jack Champion, Devyn Nekoda, Liana Liberato, Tony Revolori, Samara Weaving, Henry Czerny, and Dermot Mulroney joining the ensemble cast. The plot follows a new Ghostface killer, who begins targeting the survivors of the "Woodsboro legacy murders" in New York City.

The Pope's Exorcist is a 2023 supernatural horror film directed by Julius Avery from a screenplay by Michael Petroni and Evan Spiliotopoulos, based on the 1990 book An Exorcist Tells His Story and the 1992 book An Exorcist: More Stories by Father Gabriele Amorth. The film stars Russell Crowe as Amorth, with Daniel Zovatto, Alex Essoe, and Franco Nero in supporting roles.

Knock at the Cabin is a 2023 American apocalyptic psychological horror film written and directed by M. 
Famous rock band, The Beatles, will finally be releasing their last song, "Now and Then", featuring all four original members of the band. The song was originally written and played by John Lennon in the late 1970s, who unfortunately passed away in 1980. A demo version, along with the demos for "Free As a Bird" and "Real Love", was

given to Paul McCartney in 1994. "Free As a Bird" and "Real Love" were completed and released by the three remaining members of the band. However, Lennon's vocals and piano were unable to be separated to work alongside McCartney, George Harrison, and Ringo Starr in "Now and Then", and the song was shelved. Using new A.I technology, they were able to separate Lennon's vocals and piano, and rip his voice from the original demo. There was a recent controversial fan speculation about the song's use of A.I. People were upset about them potentially using the technology to artificially recreate John Lennon's voice, with Paul McCartney assuring that everything in the song is real. Lennon's son, Sean Ono Lennon, has commented on the making of the song, and showed great gratitude that they were still working together after the many years his father has been gone.

"Now and Then" will be teased in a new 13-minute documentary releasing on November 2nd, with the full song premiering the next day.



Scientists at NASA hope Psyche may be able to tell us how Earth's core and the cores of the other rocky planets came to be. Psyche's core is made of iron, nickel, and gold, similar to Earth's core. Scientists at NASA hope we can learn more about Earth by investigating other iron cores.

Psyche is a collaboration between NASA and SpaceX, and will be aboard a SpaceX Falcon Heavy rocket at Launch Complex 39A in the Kennedy Space Center in Florida. Can't go to the launch site in person? Members of the public can attend as a virtual guest. As a virtual guest, you will receive access to curated resources, schedule changes, and mission-specific information delivered straight to your inbox. Following each activity, virtual guests will receive a commemorative stamp for their virtual guest passports. The live broadcast will begin at 9:30 AM EDT or 6:30 AM PST on Thursday, October 12.














Mr. Pearson Wins Back the Crown!


