Bird Flu Outbreak Spreads to Minks! Allison Spencer Staff

The bird flu started in Europe fall of 2020 and spread to Africa. Early last October the minks at a farm in Spain got sick. Some of the symptoms of the sick minks are not eating, salivating excessively, clumsy, tremor and bloody snouts.

Scientists first thought it was Covid-19 but soon realized it was H5N1, a type of influenza virus that causes a highly infectious, severe respiratory disease in birds. This bird flu has killed about 52.7

million birds. Some other types of mammals that might feed on infected birds have gotten H5N1 also, such as foxes, raccoons and bears. The minks

get fed raw chicken so there is a chance



that some of the chicken had H5N1. If one mink is infected it

could spread to other minks and keep on spreading. This means that it has now adapted to some mammals

instead of just birds. Some of the animals at the mink farm were tested for H5N1 and if they were positive they were killed.

Already 51000 minks have been killed due to the bird flu to stop further spread. Scientists think that a more likely source of the virus was a wild bird. Plus they detected that some wild bird had H5N1 in the area. The minks' food is like a paste and when they feed the minks they smear some on the top of the cage. Other animals and birds could be attracted to the minks' food. If they were to carry the bird flu it could spread to the minks.

There have been less than 10 known cases in humans but no human-to-human transmission. The virus has not adapted well to humans yet. Eleven farm workers had contact with an infected mink but all tested negative. The mink farm also has some other animals such as cats and dogs that could act as hosts for the virus. Some of them have gotten H5N1. Sometimes minks get loose so if it had H5N1 it could give it to a wild animal or one of the other kinds of animal on the farm.

Mink farms normally use their minks for their fur, meaning they kill them to make decorate hoods, pom-poms, collars, scarves, purses, shoes, boots, and key chains. So technically they would die anyway but if they were babies then you wouldn't be able to use their fur. be sharing the same thought.

Standley Middle School's 6th Graders entered an art contest for the Read-Imagine-Create program sponsored by San Diego's Write Out Loud. Students received a brand new, free-to-keep, copy of Andrew Krivak's novel <u>The Bear</u>, exploring the community we share with nature. With this book, students learned **theme** expressed with depth; for example, instead of claiming one theme Andrew Krivak conveys is survival, students learned to expand upon that theme by asking, "What about survival?" Andrew Krivak reveals that survival requires knowledge, skill, and patience. 


Sci-Fi Movies Coming out in 2023 Evan Lopez Staff



Anticipated Sci-fi and Superhero movies coming in 2023 and beyond, and I hope everyone enjoys them as much as they should.




